In the interest of Health Safety for the Pilot (PIC) and Passenger (Student or Instructor), please take a minute to fill out this questionnaire prior to our appointment.

Thank-you for completing this informational survey. In addition, We will be conducting an in person temperature test, using a non-contact infrared thermometer, of both the PIC and Passenger (Student) at the beginning of our appointment.

If either the Pilot (PIC) or Passenger (Student or Instructor) develops any of the above listed symptoms of COVID-19 or has a positive test for COVID-19 within 14 days following this appointment, we will notify a member of the CGC Board of such a situation. This ensures contact tracing as a person may be contagious prior to developing symptoms. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

Dr. Mike Greenwald adds the following notation.....

A large number of people are on low dose Aspirin, and others take it for headaches, etc. Aspirin is a highly effective agent for reducing fevers. Many other NSAIDS do so as well. The restriction we use should simply say NO-ONE taking any NSAID, anti-viral or antibiotic medicine for any reason whatsoever may use or be carried in CGC equipment. Naming specific forbidden medicines is an impossible challenge - there are too many of them. I recognize that my thoughts are more restrictive, but the threat of a potentially serious or even early disease justifies that. I suggest that the above is needed in addition to the restrictions otherwise already named.
